Geopolitical developments have become an increasingly important consideration for both economies and financial markets. In a candid dialogue with **Pranay Gupta**, Adjunct Associate Professor at Nanyang Technological University, he shares his views on the tensions of today that will shape our future world and how we can navigate the changing dynamics.

## Mr. Bilahari Kausikan Chairman, Middle East Institute, National University of Singapore

Mr. Bilahari Kausikan is currently Chairman of the Middle East Institute, an autonomous institute of the National University of Singapore. He was previously Ambassador-at-Large in the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MFA) of Singapore (2013-18), Permanent Representative to the United Nations (1995-98) and Ambassador to Russia (1994-95). He also concurrently served as the Ambassador to Mexico and the High Commissioner to Canada. Mr. Kausikan has been awarded the Public Administration Medal (Gold) by the Government of Singapore, the Order of Bernardo O'Higgins (Gran Cruz) by the President of the Republic of Chile, and the Oman Civil Merit Order (Second Class) from the Sultan of Oman. Mr. Kausikan studied Political Science at the University of Singapore and received a Master of Arts degree from Columbia University. He is the author of two books 'Dealing with an Ambiguous World' and Singapore is not an Island and is often referred to as "Singapore's undiplomatic diplomat".

Pranay Gupta has over 25 years of experience in managing asset management teams in Europe, United States, Asia and the Middle East.
